

My preschooler LOVES interesting weather. This book is a little misleading though -- the tornado on the cover isn't really the kind of weather this book is about. Inside is filled with pictures of kids playing in the pool in the sun, or in the rain, etc. I thought this was going to be a kid-friendly version of pics and descriptions of tornadoes, hurricanes, that kind of thing. He's pretty bored with this one after just a couple read throughs.

The "pre-readers" level books are extremely simple & great because she memorizes the words & can "read" it herself. These are really getting her interested in nature, animals & science... I will continue to buy these as they are released, for our collection!

These books were really good for showing the parts of non fiction books, like table of contents and glossary. Had interesting pictures and goofy kid jokes thrown in. Good for advanced kinder readers too. I like the little mini quiz at the end too.

My three-year-old grand daughter is intrigued by weather, particularly tornadoes (we live in Kansas). Looking for a book to help her understand weather, I was drawn to this book for two reasons: the name, National Geographic; the cover and the description of the contents (particularly regarding tornadoes), led me to believe, erroneously, this book would be helpful. Very, very limited information in all categories. A complete disappointment.

My 4 year old son is very interested in tornados. The picture on the cover caught my eye. There isn't specific information on any type of weather. This is more of an introduction (Level 1) to what weather is. The information and pictures were well worth the price and it is also a good beginners book to reading. I would recommend it if you aren't looking for a detailed book on weather.

As with all National Geographic books, this book is amazingly interesting reading with colorful illustrations that make reading a joyful experience for all ages.

We use these books to introduce unit themes to my preschooler at home. It presents the information in a simplified way and introduces a few new vocabulary words. Works great for our purposes!
