

This almanac has some great information about the presidents and various other facts about the world.I took off 2 stars mostly because I'm comparing this almanac with two others: The Old Farmer's Almanac for Kids 2014 which I give a solid 5 stars to, and the National Geographic Kids Almanac 2014 which I'll probably give 4 stars to (although it is almost as good as the Old Farmer's Almanac for Kids). The World Almanac for Kids has too many pop culture references. If you want your kid to know some information about bestselling music artists, that they share a birthday with some obscure celebrity instead of somebody like Benjamin Franklin, or some info about Justin Bieber, then this is the almanac for your kids. Maybe it would be good for education in those topics if your child is going to be in a trivia contest or on Jeopardy, other than that, I think that information is pointless and serves no real educational purpose.I can't give it less than 3 stars, though, because it does keep kids occupied with something to read and has some fun and useful information. I just think it could be better and less pop culture focused.

My grandson had the 2013 almanac and read it cover to cover. He is now enjoying this one. He's eleven and I keep it in the car for him. That's what he grabs as soon as we get in the car. It's refreshing to see him actually reading instead of playing an electronic game.
