

Instead, they helped their parents with chores and played games such as marbles. There were no convenient grocery stores. Pilgrims had to hunt and gather food, then cook their meals on an open fire or in an outdoor oven. Dramatic photos of historical reenactments combine with lively text to give today's children a vivid sense of daily life in Plymouth colony. I use this book in my second grade class to introduce Thanksgiving and our study of the Pilgrims and Wampanoag people. The book is published by National Geographic and has stunning photographs taken at the Plimouth Living History Museum. It has simple text (great for 1-3) and gives a nice overview of pilgrim life. My students find this book fascinating... they're intrigued by the pictures and descriptions of a life so different from theirs. One caveat: if you're looking for a book about the "First Thanksgiving" this is not it. Its primary focus is on everyday pilgrim life. Try 1621: A New Look at Thanksgiving, instead.

This is a great pictorial primer on the first Pilgrims and the first Thanksgiving. Other teachers I work with want one too especially when Thanksgiving rolls around. One of my students just said great things about it.

All of these National Geographic books are great and you cannot go wrong for the price. They have beautiful photography and make learning come alive for kids. Both my five year old and seven year old love these books and we bring them out as the seasons change to help illustrate what is going on in our own back yard. Your child will not even know he/she is learning!

I like this book because it gives enough detail about the Pilgrims but also has great pictures. I used it in my classroom (self-contained Special Education), but the book would be appropriate for preK-1st or maybe 2nd grade.

I enjoyed this book and so did my class! We had a great time reading and seeing what pilgrim life was like. The seller made sure the product was in great condition and it arrived right on time!
