

This is a great step by step description of all the best ways and tricks to catch ol' St. Nick!Told in an informal, "how-to" style, two kids give us some great things to think about such as "What questions would you ask Santa if/when you catch him?" Would you want to give him anything (a nose warmer for cold sleigh rides, for example)? There are also some ideas on how you might be able to capture the jolly old man- give him a really tricky riddle so he has to wake you up to get the answer or bake him cookies and leave them in your room.I love the young, innocent, and excited voice that this book uses. It is sure to bring delight to young and old alike (and will no doubt inspire some Santa catching in your household).
